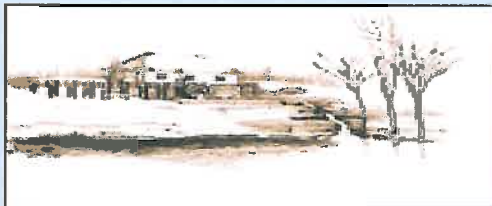


Bridging the Community with PRIDE
